

Private Banking Collective Bargaining 2024



12.5 percent more! At least 500 euros more! 250 euros more for junior staff!

The issue is this: The inflation of recent years has led to a noticeable loss of purchasing power. Even if the inflation values have decreased again recently: Inflation is still here and continues to create sustained loss of real wages. This year's collective bargaining round is about stopping further losses. More money will not come by itself. As we know this, we are engaging a strength test with our demand for employees in the collective bargaining round for the private banking sector. The intention is to show how many colleagues across Germany support our demand for a 12.5 percent pay rise - yet at least 500 euros more - as well as 250 euros more for junior staff. NOW IT IS UP TO ALL OF US!

This strength test will continue until May 31, 2024. With a large number of signatures even before the first negotiation in June we want to show that a majority in our industry stand behind our demand for a significant pay rise.
